	Body Structure	
	Physical structure and function	Structure describes the physical make-up of the body and functions are the physiological functions of body systems.
0	Normal	No physical differences when compared with same age peers.
1	Suspected disability	Suspected difference in physical build which could potentially affect physiological functions of the body's structure, but has not interfered with function at this time. (i.e. limp, abnormal gait, unusual posture)
2	Mild disability	An apparent difference in physical build which may minimally affect physiological functions of the body's structure and abilities. Student does not typically need direct adult interventions to participate in tasks (i.e. missing digit on hand, mild cleft palate, minor burns)
3	Moderate disability	An obvious physical deformity that may moderately affect physiological functions of the body's structure and abilities. Student needs occasional adult assistance to participate in tasks due to moderate limitations. (i.e. brachial plexus injury, burns requiring therapy and nursing interventions, posture that interferes with classroom seating and mobility)
4	Severe disability	An obvious physical deformity that significantly affects physiological functions of the body's structure and abilities. (i.e. needs adult interventions to participate in tasks, as well as using adaptive equipment, wheelchair, walker, prosthesis with adult assistance)
5	Profound disability	A life-altering physical deformity that requires constant caregiver assistance to participate in tasks. (i.e. missing extremities, paralysis)
